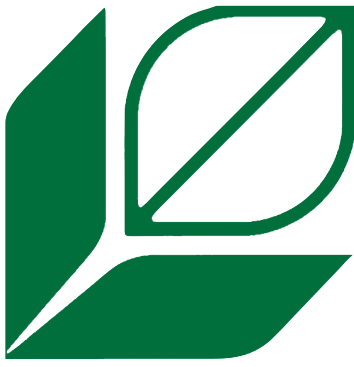

Shrubs

AMUR MAPLE (<i>Acer ginnala</i>) Very hardy, dense shrub with red summer fruit, fragrant flowers and brilliant scarlet-red fall color. Can prune to a small tree.	7.00	65.00	10
SASKATOON SERVICEBERRY (<i>Amelanchier alnifolia</i>) Masses of small white flowers. Red to orange fall foliage. Good wildlife food and erosion control. Fruit good for preserves or syrup. Native.	5.00	45.00	10
McKENZIE BLACK CHOKEBERRY (<i>Aronia melanocarpa</i> 'McKenzie') White spring flowers, glossy dark green leaves turn reddish orange to deep purple in fall. Dark purple fruit used in juice blends, preserves. Relatively pest and disease free.	5.00	45.00	10
JAPANESE BARBERRY (<i>Berberis thunbergii</i>) Hardy hedge plant, dense, rounded shrub. Rich red fall color, red berries hang on all winter.	5.00	45.00	10
SWEET SHRUB (<i>Calycanthus floridus</i>) Reddish brown 2" blooms produce a fruity fragrance during spring/summer. Yellow fall foliage. Disease and pest resistant, adaptable to a variety of soils, sun or shade.	5.00	45.00	10
SIBERIAN PEASHRUB (<i>Caragana arborescens</i>) Very easy to grow drought tolerant shrub good for hot, dry areas. Yellow spring flowers.	4.00	35.00	10
RED STEM CEANOTHUS, WILD LILAC (<i>Ceanothus sanguineus</i>) Dark Red stems, fragrant spring blooms. Best on well-drained sites, heat and drought tolerant. Browse for deer, elk and moose. Northwest native.	3.00	25.00	10
JAPANESE FLOWERING QUINCE (<i>Chaenomeles japonica</i>) Early blooming with very bright red to orange flowers, glossy green leaves. Specimen plant or easily sheared to hedge. Tolerant of extremes in heat, cold and soils.	3.00	25.00	10
FLOWERING QUINCE VARIETIES (<i>Chaenomeles</i> var.) Jet Trail - White early spring blooms, glossy green leaves. Spitfire - Red blooms late winter, smaller upright habit. Texas Scarlet - Red flowers, compact spreading habit. Toyo-Nishiki - Pink, white and red blooms on the same plant. Upright growth habit.	4.00	35.00	10
SIBERIAN DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus alba sibirica</i>) Exceptionally colorful coral-red branches in winter. Extremely winter hardy.	4.00	35.00	10
SILKY DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus amomum</i>) Purple spreading branches. Leaves dark green. Yellowish white flowers.	5.00	45.00	10
CORNELIAN CHERRY DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus mas</i>) Specimen shrub, hedge or windbreak. Purplish red fall color, edible bright scarlet fruit.	7.00	65.00	10
REDSTONE CORNELIAN CHERRY DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus mas</i> 'Redstone') Early spring golden-yellow flowers, edible cherry-red fruit attracts wildlife or used in sauces, preserves and syrups. Mottled bark adds winter interest.	6.00	55.00	10
RED OSIER DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus sericea</i>) Colorful all year. Grows rapidly to multi-stem shrub. Ideal for holding soil on steep banks. NW native.	3.00	25.00	10
YELLOW TWIG DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus sericea</i> 'Flaviramea') Golden-yellow branches. Similar to Red Osier Dogwood.	6.00	55.00	10
PURPLE SMOKEBUSH (<i>Cotinus coggygria</i> 'Purpureus') Purple leaves crowned by puffs of feathery-smoky pink blooms, best leaf color in full sun. Drought tolerant.	6.00	55.00	10
HEDGE COTONEASTER (<i>Cotoneaster lucidus</i>) Spreading shrub. White blooms, bright red fruit. Red fall color.	5.00	45.00	10
SILVERBERRY, WOLF WILLOW (<i>Elaeagnus commutata</i>) Tiny fragrant flowers followed by silvery berries for the birds. Reddish brown stems, silvery leaves. Native to Northern Plains.	5.00	45.00	10
VERNAL WITCH HAZEL (<i>Hamamelis vernalis</i>) Excellent streambank erosion control, upright habit. Small yellow-red fragrant flowers in very early spring. Hardy, durable plant.	4.00	35.00	10
COMMON WITCH HAZEL (<i>Hamamelis virginiana</i>) Large shrub with open form, crooked branches. Prefers moist soil. Aromatic yellow flowers in late fall.	4.00	35.00	10

WHITE FIR (<i>Abies concolor</i>) Withstands heat and drought better than other firs. Soft silvery needles.	4.00	35.00	10
ALPINE FIR (<i>Abies lasiocarpa</i>) Blue-green needles. Dense, pyramidal form, corky white bark.	4.00	35.00	10
NORDMANN FIR (<i>Abies nordmanniana</i>) Densely branched from the ground up, 20' wide. Shiny, dark green needles, white to pale green beneath. Recommended species for commercial Christmas tree production.	3.00	25.00	10
INCENSE CEDAR (<i>Calocedrus decurrens</i>) Dense pyramidal crown, rich green foliage. Tolerates blazing summer heat and poor soils, but prefers the opposite. Excellent high screen or windbreak.	4.00	35.00	10
ROCKY MOUNTAIN JUNIPER (<i>Juniperus scopulorum</i>) Rugged native, drought tolerant tree with silvery-blue foliage. Upright form.	4.00	35.00	10
EASTERN RED CEDAR (<i>Juniperus virginiana</i>) Densely pyramidal tree, easily pruned. Very well adapted to dry sites.	3.00	25.00	10
EUROPEAN LARCH (<i>Larix decidua</i>) Deciduous conifer with lighter green foliage than other Larch. Brilliant yellow and orange fall color. Fast growing.	3.00	25.00	10
AMERICAN LARCH (<i>Larix laricina</i>) Fast growth, narrow, conical form. Light green to blue-green foliage, bright yellow fall color.	3.00	25.00	10
JAPANESE LARCH (<i>Larix leptolepis</i>) Superior ornamental to all other Larch in cultivation. Red-brown exfoliating bark. Frequent bonsai subject. Deciduous conifer with fall color.	4.00	35.00	10
DAWN REDWOOD (<i>Metasequoia glyptostroboides</i>) Looks somewhat like our own Coast Redwood but with much smaller cones and soft bright green leaves. Light fall color. Very fast growing when young.	4.00	35.00	10
NORWAY SPRUCE (<i>Picea abies</i>) Very fast growing and cold hardy conifer. Excellent choice for windbreaks and screens.	4.00	35.00	10
ENGLERMAN SPRUCE (<i>Picea engelmannii</i>) Light bluish needles, dense pyramidal form. Native throughout the Rockies.	4.00	35.00	10
WHITE SPRUCE (<i>Picea glauca</i>) Silver-green foliage on pendulous branches. Tolerant of wind, wet soils. Native to the northern U.S. and Canada.	3.00	25.00	10
COLORADO BLUE SPRUCE (<i>Picea pungens glauca</i>) Popular ornamental spruce. Slow to moderate growth, branches to the ground.	4.00	35.00	10
MAJESTIC BLUE SPRUCE (<i>Picea pungens glauca</i> 'Majestic Blue') A special seed grown selection reported to have fast growth and over 90% blue color (not guaranteed).	7.00	65.00	10
JACK PINE (<i>Pinus banksiana</i>) Northern most pine of North America. Easiest pine to transplant, even on difficult sites. Used for pulpwood and windbreaks.	3.00	25.00	10
ROCKY MOUNTAIN LODGEPOLE PINE (<i>Pinus contorta latifolia</i>) Tall slender tree with virtually no taper, thin bark with a clean trunk.	4.00	35.00	10
LIMBER PINE (<i>Pinus flexilis</i>) Young trees conical becoming rounded, windswept with age. Dark gray, deeply furrowed bark. Heat, cold and drought tolerant. Native from Alberta to Texas.	3.00	25.00	10
BOSNIAN PINE (<i>Pinus leucodermis</i>) Compact dwarf, growing 3-6" per year. Excellent for small gardens. One of Europe's most common ornamental pines. Well suited to dry or shallow soils.	3.00	25.00	10
PONDEROSA PINE (<i>Pinus ponderosa</i>) Fast growing native tree. Used for forest and timber trees.	2.00	15.00	10
SOUTHWESTERN WHITE PINE (<i>Pinus strobiformis</i>) A five needle pine, ornamental. Good for Christmas trees. Bright blue needles.	4.00	35.00	10
EASTERN WHITE PINE (<i>Pinus strobus</i>) Five needle Pine used for Christmas trees, windbreaks, wildlife habitat, landscaping. Fast growing, adaptable. Transplants easily in a wide range of soils.	4.00	35.00	10

HEDGE MAPLE (<i>Acer campestre</i>) Ideal for clipped hedges and screens due to dense growth. Dark green foliage turns golden-yellow in fall. Tolerates dry, compacted, alkaline soils once established. Wind and air pollution resistant.	5.00	45.00	10
AMUR MAPLE (<i>Acer ginnala</i>) Very hardy, dense shrub with red summer fruit, fragrant flowers and brilliant scarlet-red fall color. Can prune to a small tree.	5.00	45.00	10
JAPANESE MAPLE (<i>Acer palmatum</i>) Green-leaved, fall colors often turn brilliant shades of yellow to red. Ornamental.	5.00	45.00	10
RED JAPANESE MAPLE (<i>Acer palmatum</i> 'Atropurpureum') Red leaved, known for brilliant, season long, dark red leaf color which deepens in fall. Best growth when partially shaded and sheltered from intense sun and wind.	6.00	55.00	10
RED MAPLE (<i>Acer rubrum</i>) Fast growing and cold hardy shade tree. Bright scarlet fall color.	3.00	25.00	10
SUN VALLEY RED MAPLE (<i>Acer rubrum</i> 'Sun Valley') Fast growing and cold hardy shade tree. Bright scarlet fall color.	10.00	95.00	10
SILVER MAPLE (<i>Acer saccharinum</i>) Graceful and fast growing native shade tree. Silvery bark.	5.00	45.00	10
SUGAR MAPLE (<i>Acer saccharum</i>) Large ornamental shade tree, famous fall foliage in shades of yellow, orange, red.	5.00	45.00	10
TATARIAN MAPLE (<i>Acer tataricum</i>) Shrub or small tree tolerant of high pH and dry conditions. Red to yellow autumn color. Good choice where a small tree is desired.	4.00	35.00	5
HORSE CHESTNUT (<i>Aesculus hippocastanum</i>) White candle-like blooms in May. Prefers moist well-drained sites, tolerates partial shade. Pest resistant.	7.00	65.00	10
RED ALDER (<i>Alnus rubra</i>) Fast, colonizing growth, forming thickets on disturbed sites within 5 years. Good for reclamation uses, wildlife browse/cover. Easily trained as an attractive ornamental specimen.	4.00	35.00	10
CHERRY BIRCH, SWEET BIRCH (<i>Betula lenta</i>) Narrowly upright habit. Cherry-like dark brown-red non-peeling bark. Dark glossy green leaves turn golden-yellow in fall. Native to eastern North America.	3.00	25.00	10
RIVER BIRCH (<i>Betula nigra</i>) Absolute resistance to Bronze Birch Borer. Dark cinnamon to light creamy brown bark peels in shaggy chunks. Excellent heat and cold tolerance. Withstands flooding.	4.00	35.00	10
EUROPEAN WHITE BIRCH (<i>Betula pendula</i>) Superb ornamental tree with peeling silvery-white bark. Pendulous branches offer a graceful effect.	3.00	25.00	10
JAPANESE WHITE BIRCH (<i>Betula platyphylla</i> 'Japonica') Pure white bark, shiny green leaves, yellow fall color. Tolerates summer heat better than European or Paper Birches. Fast growth.	3.00	25.00	10
KATSURA TREE (<i>Cercidiphyllum japonicum</i>) One of the most beautiful small landscape trees. Brilliant red or yellow fall color.	5.00	45.00	10
EASTERN REDBUD (<i>Cercis canadensis</i>) Small multi-stem tree with purplish pink flowers before leaves. Highly ornamental.	5.00	45.00	10
FLOWERING DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus florida</i>) White flowers, brilliant red fruit, scarlet autumn color. Performs best in high shade.	4.00	35.00	10
CHINESE KOUSSA DOGWOOD (<i>Cornus kousa</i> 'Chinensis') Wide spreading small tree. Showy white flowers with red edible fruit. Grows in sun or partial shade.	4.00	35.00	10
DOUGLAS HAWTHORN (<i>Crataegus douglasii</i>) Small tree with pendulous branches, dark green, shiny leaves. Black berries liked by birds.	3.00	25.00	10
SINGLE SEEDED ENGLISH HAWTHORN (<i>Crataegus monogyna</i>) Small white flowers, red fruit 1" thorns. Can be planted and pruned as a single stem tree or as an impenetrable hedge.	3.00	25.00	10
